#### Quarantine Times for Sickness and Diarrhoea

Following on from the bouts of sickness that befell school just before the half-term holidays, this week in school we have received updated guidance from Public Health England about how long children should remain away from school following a bout of sickness or diarrhoea. In the past we have followed the advice of the School Nurse Service which has advised a gap of 24 hours, but Public Health England are now saying that a gap of 48 hours is advisable. We hope that all parents will appreciate and follow this guidance in order to stop the undue spread of symptoms in school. Many thanks to you all.


