Dear Parents and Governors

We now find ourselves four weeks into the new school year and so much has happened in that time with us all getting our heads around the new version of school, full of new timings, rules and safety measures.

First of all I would like to say thank you to everyone for trying to follow these new arrangements and keep everyone safe. Here at Four Oaks we are determined to keep the school open and to keep the children in the best place that they can learn, however at this point I would like to draw a few reminders and a few new arrangements to everyone's attention.

New Developments

- From Monday Morning the schools belonging to the Learning Trust have all decided that we would like all parents to wear facemasks when collecting children on site after school. Following on from the Prime Minister's broadcast earlier this week we all now realise that we need to take even more stringent measures to combat the spread of coronavirus, so I'm sure we will have no parents who will not want to play their part and do such a simple thing!
- Also from this point onwards, if your child has symptoms of coronavirus and is awaiting test results we
 will not be able to have any siblings of that child in school (whether they have symptoms or not) until
 the test results come through. Similarly if it is a parent who is taken ill with symptoms then we would ask
 that the children are kept at home until the parent's test results have been received. Thank you for your
 co-operation in this matter.
- If any child does end up having to isolate from school because another family member has tested positive we now have a set of 2 week long "Remote Learning" packs available for every year group. Please access Wordpress, click on your child's year group and you will see the remote learning pack at the top of the screen. There is a suggested timetable to help guide you through their learning. This is really important so that all children can continue their learning journey back into school life and children will be expected to complete the work so that teachers can assess their progress. We hope that all parents will support their children in accessing this work on-line.
- From Monday if your child has come into school and they have forgotten either a drinks bottle, a book or maybe they have forgotten to wear their PE kit then please do not worry about dropping them to school later. At present this system presents a real challenge for us as we have been advised that our office staff should not be coming out to the gate and our Teaching Assistants cannot be leaving the classroom all the time. If there is a problem then just phone school and we will be happy to provide a drink for any child and it will be fine for to do a PE activity in the clothes they are wearing.

Reminders

- Can I remind everyone that the only parents that are allowed on site in the morning are parents of FOSBACS children and that once they have dropped their children they must vacate the site straight away.
- No parents are allowed on site during the day other than by agreed invitation and then they must wear a
 face mask.

Reminders ~ continued

- When parents come on site in the afternoon this is the time when the most adults are on site and because of this we must look after each other. Please do not stand around talking to friends once you have picked children up and please leave an appropriate space between yourselves and others whilst waiting. When coming through the two pedestrian gates please give everyone else enough space to feel comfortable and respect everyone else's feelings. Once through the gate then please do not congregate on Edge Hill Road with other families thus making it more difficult for other people to vacate the site.
- We are aware that the ice cream van is often outside school on a Monday, can you please keep two
 metres apart and move away as quickly as possible to avoid congestion.
- It would be fantastic if more families could walk to school and try to keep traffic to a minimum on Edge Hill Road. When I was on gate duty on Wednesday morning there was almost gridlock with some adults getting highly impatient with other drivers. If we and our children are to remain safe then we must all play our part. In addition to this can I also remind the many parents who are dropping off their children on the zig zags outside the Junior entrance that this is not allowed and puts everyone in a dangerous position.
- Lastly can I remind everyone that many children have been away from school for an
 extremely long time and are finding coming back to a whole school day a genuine challenge,
 and this is no surprise. We are seeing lots of yawning little faces and children starting to
 flag by the afternoon so the best thing that they can do is to get a good night's sleep.
 Thanks for your help in this.



Secondary School Open Days

This year all schools have been instructed that they are not allowed to stage Open Days or Open Evenings where adults and children are actually invited onto school sites.
