Dear Parents and Governors

Welcome Back to Staff and Pupils

It has been lovely to see the return of 3E since Wednesday. We have missed them and it's great to have them back with us!

I am also in the lovely position of being able to say that hopefully next Monday I will be able to say welcome back to a whole staff team. For the last few weeks we have had various staff missing from school, all of whom play pivotal roles across the site, but Monday will be the first time in a while that I can say, with a big smile on my face, that we have the whole staff team back together.....long may it continue!

COVID-19

Just to let all parents know that at present we are working under the Government Covid-19 guidelines stating that anyone in school who tests positive on an LFT or PCR test must isolate for a minimum of 5 full days. Please see below for further details. We are still working under the guidelines that state that if any child presents with any Covid symptoms in school, then parents will be contacted in order to pick up their child from school and arrange for a PCR test to be taken.

We are also still having to follow any guidance given to us by Public Health Birmingham surrounding any increase in positive cases within any of our classes, and we have no option but to abide by this guidance.

Day 0—this is the day you have symptoms or have a positive lateral flow test. (Take a PCR test if you have symptoms)

Day 1-4-Self isolate

Day 5—take a lateral flow test Negative continue to self isolate and take another test 24 hour later

Positive continue to self isolate

Day 6 take a lateral flow test Negative you may return to school

Positive continue to self isolate.

Day 6-10 continue to take lateral flow tests and when you have 2 negative lateral flow tests 24 hour apart you may return to school.

As you can see our advice would be to test first thing on a morning on day 5 and 6 so your child can come back to school on day 6 if they test negative on both days.

Can all parent please advise school when their child has had their 2 negative tests. Thank you.

BUG Club Reading

I would like to ask for the help of all parents when it comes to reading.

At present in school we have a growing number of children who are just not reading every night at home. When this happens, it soon begins to reflect in a slowing of progress across the curriculum, and it's something that can easily be put right.



We always tell the children that reading is the key to absolutely everything, and that if your reading improves then everything else gets easier. So I would ask all parents to make reading with their child a real priority each evening....it doesn't take long, but that drip-drip effect of building on really solid phonic sounds, spelling skills and word building ability definitely pays dividends in the long run!

Whilst we understand that some of our children towards the higher end of the Infants may now be starting to read small chapter books, reading Bug Club books alongside this will really help to improve their comprehension skills. Thank you for your support in this push to improve every child's life skills.

Behaviour—End of Day Collection

Can I remind all parents that once the pupils have been dismissed from the classroom at the end of the day, they are then the responsibility of their parents and carers, and the children should stay with the adults. We seem to have a growing trend of children running off from parents to run around or play football on the field, or leaving parents to play on the trim trail or adventure equipment. None of these things should be happening as accidents can easily happen, and recently children have begun to get injured. I'm sure I can count on the co-operation of all parents in looking after the safety of all children at the end of the school day!

Parent Volunteers

In the past we have often had parent volunteers who have given up their own time to come to school and help the teaching staff in various ways, but for obvious reasons this situation changed during the periods of national lockdown. These tasks have varied from reading with individuals and small groups, to the preparation of teaching materials, and helping to complete classroom and corridor displays. If there are any parents who have some free time and are willing to help out, then we would be more than happy to hear from them and return to a working partnership with parents. To begin working in school any parent would have to have a DBS (Disclosure & Barring Service) certificate stating that they are an appropriate person to work with young people, but school will pay for this application.

Parkina

Many thanks to those parents who have taken on board our pleas about careful driving and parking around the school entrances. This seems to be improving situation, and therefore our children will be safer as they arrive and depart at either end of the school day. With a new version of the Highway Code coming out can I make a timely reminder to everyone that it is illegal to park on traffic islands and zig-zags by school entrances. 
