Dear Parents and Governors

School Meals Price Increase

As every single parent will be aware, the cost of many items in the supermarkets has gone through the roof recently, and this is not a pattern which looks like slowing down. This is no different when it comes to the raw ingredients used by Debbie and her team in the school kitchen.

Having completed an audit of fresh and frozen ingredients used in school, we have some foodstuffs that have gone up in price between 25% and 122% between September 2021 and now, and so we have concluded that we have no choice other than to increase the cost of school dinners.

This will be the first time in 5 years that we have had to do this. The offer that your children get in terms of food at Four Oaks, I hope you would agree, is amazing. The proof of the pudding is that currently we have 382 pupils out of 421 having a hot dinner. I can assure you that this level of uptake is unheard of in other schools, and often I am asked if Debbie could be transferred to other schools. Obviously, the answer is always a resounding...NO!

Most other schools only offer a basic menu which has two options, which results in a single choice for the children. We at Four Oaks have never thought that this is acceptable thing to do, especially if we want children to have a healthy meal which enables them to be settled for their learning in class.



At present a child's school dinner costs parents £2.50 a day, but from the start of next half-term that price will go up to £2.80 a day. I hope parents will agree that it would be impossible to get a meal at the quality we provide by spending £2.80 anywhere else.

Incredibly, and I appreciate that parents do not normally know this, here at school we presently subsidise our school meals offer by an average of £23,000 a year. With present funding we cannot afford to increase this contribution from school.

I hope that all parents can appreciate the logical reasons behind this change, and we hope that you all continue in thinking that Debbie's dinners are the best school dinners in the world!

With the pressures of the school day we are unable to stand on the gates past 9am, and this has always been the time at which all children should be in school. I would like to ask all parents to make a huge effort to get their children to school on time. If you are late in getting to school then all parents must bring children to the main pedestrian gate on the junior side of the site.

Road Resurfacing

Good news! The Council have finally decided to resurface Edge Hill Road and I am sure you will all agree with me that it's condition can only be improved!

They will be closing Edge Hill Road between Walsall Road and Blackberry Lane for a period of 2 weeks, commencing on Monday 30^{th} May and are due to finish on 11^{th} June.



Having said this, the Council have stated that these are approximate dates as the duration of the works can be affected by many factors.

It will involve a full road closure between the hours of 9.30am and 3.30pm, and this has obvious implications for school drop off and pick up during the second week of the works, which is our first week back after the Whitsun half-term. I would ask all parents to be very careful around the school entrances and to abide by all traffic and parking restrictions.

This will be outside 37a Edge Hill Road but again this will entail the bottom half of Edge Hill Road being closed between 9.00am and 3.00pm. 

<u>YouTube</u>


Unlike regular TV, YouTube offers young people the chance to be content creators as well as consumers. YouTubing can be a very lucrative and nowadays many youngsters see this as a potential career. With companies now using Youtubers or influencers to promote their goods it's easy to see why it's so popular.

If your child uses YouTube and wants to create their own channel, you should be aware that YouTube doesn't allow children under 13 to create their own channel and so as a parent you should take ownership and manage the content for them. 13-17 year olds can do so but only with parental permission.
