### **Book Fair**



During the week beginning 6th February the Book Fair will be visiting school again. ## **Industrial Action**

You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU union has declared strike action, which will take place on 1st February, 1st March, 15th March and 16th March 2023. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the teaching unions and the government over teachers' pay, and not because of any issues at our school.

I wrote to all parents earlier this week, but I will take this opportunity again to confirm that Four Oaks Primary School will be open as usual on the above dates as far as we know. Please send your child in as normal. If this situation changes due to our staff's own children's schools closing then I will inform parents as quickly as possible.

## Use of Social Media - Year 6

Unfortunately, I find myself asking for parental help and support in this matter again.

This week we have had to deal with highly inappropriate language and behaviour by Y6 pupils on social media sites. I would ask all Year 6 parents to carefully police their children's use of any social media chat groups, on phones or any other devices, and to take responsible steps if they encounter any inappropriate language or behaviour. Every child has the right to be able to come to school without feeling stressed or threatened, and no child has the right to make any other child feel uncomfortable. This matter is totally out of staff's control, but totally within parents' control, and we would ask that everyone works together to make sure our children are happy and can learn effectively when they come to school.


