Governor Update

From time to time we like to raise parents' awareness of who our Governors really are. They do a fantastic job in the background of school life, and bring a wide variety of skills to the job of running the school. Below you can read all about our Chair of the Governing Body, Mrs Debbie Jones:

Hi, my name is Debbie Jones, I have been a Governor since 2019 and am currently the Chair of our Governing Body. A former teacher, I was a member of staff at Four Oaks from 2008 to 2015 and loved it! Primary School Science is my passion and while at Four Oaks, I was made a Fellow of the Primary Science Teaching Trust - it was the highlight of my teaching career!

Since retiring from the classroom, I have worked as an Independent Primary Science Consultant for both the PSTT and Edina Trust who give money to schools in eligible authorities for Science resources (sadly not Birmingham). Edina Trust has now left the Midlands so I have recently become fully retired.

I live locally with my husband Stephen and have two children: my daughter is a teacher in an international school in Nigeria, and my son is in the RAF and is currently based in Brunei. I have four grandchildren, aged from ten down to two, who I adore but don't see as often as I would like to at the moment - needless to say, I spoil them rotten when we do get to see them!

School Gates

Having said that we are awaiting another visit for further tests on the concrete in the Infant Boiler House and three small rooms at the rear of the kitchen. We have been flexible and have insisted upon limited access to these areas by staff, but I'm sure that we will soon be given the all clear and access will be back to normal.

Parents' Workshops

This week and next week will see all of our Parents' Workshops being staged. These events are a traditional feature of our first half-term in school and offer parents and carers the opportunity to come into school and learn lots of important facts about the work their children will be undertaking in their new year groups, with their new teachers. We hope that you find them informative sessions, and a useful way to support your child in their new exciting learning adventure.

School Improvement Plan Parental Input

During your parent workshop you will be given a SIP (school improvement plan) questionnaire to complete. This can be completed at home after the workshop and brought back into school. We really value the input of parents in improving our school and will always listen to suggestions of ways to do this. If you could take the time to complete these and send them back in by Friday 29th September, we will take the time to go through them and see if we can implement any suggestions. You only have to complete one per family, and it would be helpful to place your children's name on the form so we can communicate with you if we need to.

In the first cross-country race of the year, in monsoon conditions, with over 100 competitors in each race, we had a top ten finisher in both the boys and girls' event. 
