Dear Parents and Governors

Welcome Back

If I haven't seen you around the school site or on the gate, can I take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy New Year! Everyone at school hopes that all of our families had a lovely Christmas, and a chance to rest and re-charge batteries.

Operation Encompass

Four Oaks Primary School works in joint operation with Birmingham Children's Trust, Birmingham City Council, and West Midlands Police. This is formally known as Operation Encompass. Operation Encompass has been established to help schools provide in-school support to children who have been present at, exposed to, or involved, in any domestic abuse incident.

We know that children can be significantly harmed, physically and/or emotionally, during these situations, and that it can also negatively affect their learning and behaviour in class. Therefore, as part of the Operation Encompass procedure, and to help mitigate the resulting negative impact, the school will now receive a confidential phone call or email from West Midlands Police before 9am the morning after police are called to any household where a child or young person has been witness to, or involved in, any reported domestic abuse incident.

Here at Four Oaks Primary School we have a dedicated and child-focussed Safeguarding Team. They are specially trained to effectively use the information the Police share, in confidence, and enable the school to provide the right support to any child and their family. We always endeavour to offer the best support possible to our pupils and believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

School Attendance and Holiday in Term-Time Requests - Local Authority Fines


Here at school, we are still receiving requests from parents for holiday leave in term-time. As I stated in one of my Summer Term newsletters, the Local Authority are now taking a much firmer stance with these kinds of requests, and I have been asked to publicise the fact that we have now had 3 further fines of £60 per parent per child sent out to families from the Local Authority since we have returned from the Christmas break. The Local Authority will continue to do this, as holiday requests during time, when children should be in school, will always be unauthorised. This is part of a concerted partnership between all Birmingham schools and the City Council to maximize children's life chances by trying to improve attendance rates, and therefore opportunities to learn, and fulfil their potential.

NSPCC Number Day

On Friday 2nd February we will be joining in with the NSPCC Number Day 2024 to have fun with Maths together whilst raising money for others less fortunate than us. We shall all be dressing up for the day - your teachers will let you know what your year group is dressing up as very soon, so keep an eye on TEAMS. To celebrate Maths, junior and infant children will be taking part in maths activities together in the morning which we very much look forward to. We have supported this charity event in the past and the NSPCC (National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children) have been grateful for our financial support, so it would be wonderful if we could all donate £1.00 via SchoolMoney (no cash sent to school please) to help others.



Lockdown Practice

Following on from Government recommendations to continually remind parents of their safeguarding procedures, we would like to share with our students, staff and parents how we implement a lockdown procedure.

A Lockdown Procedure is a sensible and proportionate response to any external or internal incident, which has the potential to pose a threat to the safety of staff and pupils in our school.

Lockdown Procedures may be activated in response to any number of situations, and it is essential that any planned procedures are tested to ensure they are robust and effective. In the event of a Full Lockdown, where it is deemed there is a direct threat to students within Four Oaks Primary School then the following guidelines will be followed where possible, as each situation requires a dynamic response:

- All pupils stay in or return inside (classroom, form room or other agreed location e.g. sports hall, assembly hall, dining room).
- External doors locked.
- Classroom doors secured.
- Windows shut and blinds drawn.
- Pupils sit quietly out of sight (e.g. under desk or around a corner).

We are advised to notify parents, by e-mail/website, with the following information if a Full Lockdown procedure has been invoked. This message will be to ensure effective communication is maintained.

"Message Sent to Parents During Lockdown"

"Four Oaks Primary School is currently in a Partial/Full Lockdown situation due to a reported incident in the local community. During this period the switchboard and entrances will be un-manned, external doors locked and nobody allowed in or out. Pupils will not be released to parents whilst in Lockdown, but we understand your concern for your child's welfare, and we are doing everything possible to ensure your child's safety. Please DO NOT call the school as this could tie up telephone lines that are needed for contacting emergency service providers. Please DO NOT come to the school as you could interfere with access by emergency service providers and may put yourselves and others in danger. We will keep you regularly updated via email and the website and will notify you as soon as you are able to collect your child. Thank you."

We carried out a Lockdown practice in school last week, as if there was a dangerous animal on site, and the children responded very sensibly. We will practise these procedures at regular intervals throughout the year.


